There is a need to establish a high-tech lab for testing wool, milk, animal feed and other products at the turn so that entrepreneurs can save the cost and time spent in testing them. D.P. Pachisia, President, District Industries Association, while sharing



his views in the meeting, said that Bikaner district is a big business centre of the state. There is a big trade of milk, wool, moth, peanuts, guar, pulses etc. from here. But no mega food park has been developed in the city nor is there a recognized food testing laboratory through which the quality of food items can be determined. The establishment of a mega food park and food testing laboratory in Bikaner city will give impetus to the business world. Mr. Ashok Modi, General Manager Lotus Dairy, Bikaner, while sharing his views in the House, said that Bikaner is a district based on animal husbandry where agriculture and dairy business are traditional. Ashok Modi felt the need to establish a high standard milk testing lab in the city so that export of milk and milk products can be possible.
