Academic Activities

Eighth Convocation of RAJUVAS

Eighth convocation of the RAJUVAS, Bikaner was organized on 15th April 2025. Hon'ble Governor and Chancellor Shri Haribhau Bagde awarded 515 students of B.V.Sc. & A.H. with degrees and 8 with gold medals, 1 silver and 1 bronze medal. His Excellency the Governor encouraged the students to plant a tree in the name of Guru Dakshina. The guest of the ceremony, Prof. Nitin V. Patil, Vice Chancellor, MAFSU, Nagpur while congratulating the students said that the glorious history of CVAS, Bikaner is well known. By focusing on a single health approach, integrated research on agriculture and animal husbandry subjects and transfer of new discoveries and technologies. Chief Guest Shri Joraram Kumawat, Hon'ble Minister Animal Husbandry, Dairy and Devasthan Department, GOR said that the state government is committed to benefit the animal husbandry through various schemes. The state government has launched the "Mukhyamantri Mangala Pashu BimaYojana" for which the work of insurance is currently going on at a fast pace. 
Animal Infertility Prevention Camp

Patent Received on Technical Improvement in the Structure of Traditional Bullock Cart

The design related to technical improvement in the structure of traditional bullock cart by the Engineering and Technology Center of RAJUVAS, Bikaner was granted patent by the Patent Office, Government of India. This design has been jointly developed by the Center's Principal Investigator, Dr. Diwakar Chaudhary and Dr. Ashok Dang. In this new design, the bulls have to only pull the load, while the work of carrying the load is done by shocker and tire mechanism. Due to this structural change, not only will the physical fatigue of the bulls be reduced, but neck related problems often seen in traditional bullock carts will also be avoided. Vice Chancellor Acharya Manoj Dixit congratulated all the concerned officials for getting the patent.



Development of 3D Printed Model
