Academic Activities

Rajasthan Pre Veterinary Test-2025

RAJUVAS, Bikaner, successfully conducted the RPVT-2025 exam for admission to the Bachelor of Veterinary and Animal Science programs on August 3rd, 2025, in different 32 centers in Bikaner, Jaipur, Udaipur, and Jodhpur. Vice Chancellor, RAJUVAS, Bikaner, Prof. Manoj Dixit, coordinated with all exam centers from the Bikaner Control Room during the exam to ensure a smooth and fair examination. Convener RPVT-2025, Prof. Urmila Panu, stated that a total of 13,101 candidates were issued online admit cards for the Rajasthan Pre-Veterinary Test, of which 9,670 appeared at all 32 exam centers. The attendance for this examination was 73.82 percent.
