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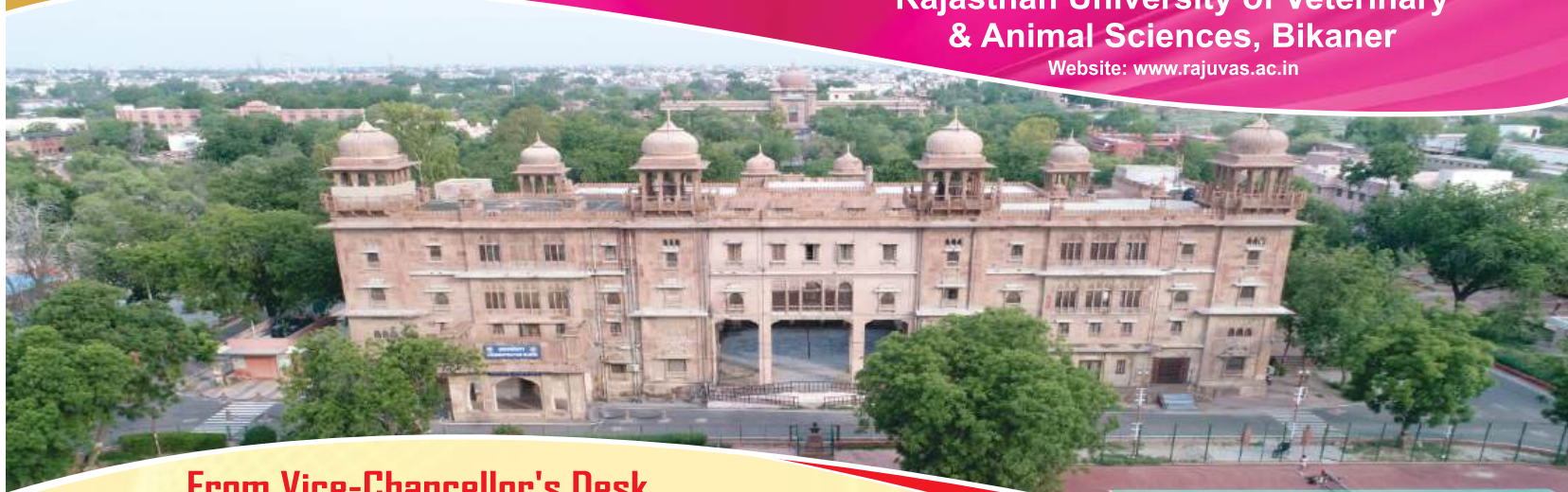

Academic Activities

Awareness Programme on Animal Biomedical Waste Disposal

An awareness program for students was organized on 8th October, 2025 at Government Girls' Senior Secondary School, Gurudwara, Rani Bazaar, Bikaner, by the Centre for Animal Biomedical Waste Disposal and Technology. Principal Investigator of the centre, Dr. Deepika Dhuria, said that the awareness program provided school students with detailed information on the proper management and disposal of biomedical waste. Assistant Professor Dr. Devendra Chaudhary explained the harmful effects of biological waste from hospitals on human health and the environment.



Zoonotic Diseases Awareness Programme

A Five Day Zoonotic Diseases Awareness Program was organized by CVAS, Navania, Udaipur from 10th to 15th November, 2025 in Government Schools of Bhatevar, Kikawas, Tarawat, and Navania. The programme was conducted under the guidance of the Dean, CVAS, Navania Udaipur Prof. Shiv Sharma. Students were provided detailed information about diseases transmitted from animals to humans (zoonotic diseases). As part of the event, a poster-making competition was also conducted.



Participation of Farmers in Prime Minister's Dhan-Dhanya Krishi Yojana Programme

Farmers and livestock owners at the RAJUVAS, Bikaner watched and listened to the online program of the Honorable Prime Minister's "PM Dhan-Dhanya Krishi Yojana and Pulses Self-Reliance Mission" on 11th October, 2025. Director Extension Education, Prof. Rajesh Kumar Dhuria, informed that approximately 98 livestock farmers from Lunkaransar, Gadwala, Bambalu and Katariyasar participated in this program, which was organized under the guidance of Vice-Chancellor Dr. Sumant Vyas. During the program, the Honorable Prime Minister launched the Dhan-Dhanya Krishi Yojana and the Pulses Self-Reliance Mission. Director Extension Education, Prof. Rajesh Kumar Dhuria, also interacted with the participating livestock farmers and apprised them of the university's extension and research activities. Mineral mixture was distributed to the livestock farmers at the end of the programme.



Workshop on Antimicrobial Resistance

A one-day workshop was organized by the Department of Veterinary Microbiology, CVAS, Bikaner, under the ICAR-INFAR project, on the occasion of World Antimicrobial Resistance Awareness Week-2025 on 18th November, 2025. The chief guest of the programme, Vice-Chancellor, RAJUVAS, Bikaner, Dr. Sumant Vyas, highlighted important aspects such as the causes promoting AMR, the necessity of laboratory diagnosis, correct dosage determination, and scientifically based treatment selection. The special guest of the program, Additional Director, Department of Animal Husbandry, Bikaner, Dr. Sanjay Sharma, encouraged all participating veterinarians to use antimicrobials responsibly. Director Research, Prof. B.N. Shringi, emphasized the need to prevent the unnecessary and excessive use of antibiotics. The welcome address was given by the Principal Investigator of the project, Dr. Rajesh Singhatia.



Workshop on Wildlife Rescue Techniques

A one-day workshop on the topic of "Wildlife Rescue Techniques" was organized by the Wildlife Studies and Management Centre, Bikaner on 12th, December, 2025. Addressing the inaugural session of the workshop, Vice-Chancellor, RAJUVAS, Bikaner, Dr. Sumant Vyas, said that wildlife is an integral part of human life and human life is not possible without wildlife. The primary veterinary care and attention given to wild animals after natural disasters and road accidents is a crucial part of their rescue. Kachhawa, stated that this center at RAJUVAS has been continuously working on the migration of migratory birds and the rehabilitation of vultures.
